Registration is Now Open

Early bird discounts available now through September 15

Registration for the 2016 Security Summit Week – October 24-28 – is now available on the [SSW website](#). Reserve your places now and lock in a 25 percent early bird discount. Registration for all the components of this year's Summit is completely ala carte. When you register, you can select any combination of days to attend as

your schedule permits.



Prices range from \$129 each for Mobile Monday, Tech Toy Tuesday presented by Malwarebytes and What's Up Wednesday – all of which will be held at LaCentre in

Westlake.

There is a separate charge of \$149 (which includes free valet parking) for the Summit Healthcare Day @HIMSS which will be held in conjunction with the Northern Ohio Chapter of the Healthcare Information and Management Systems Society (HIMSS) at the downtown [Global Center for Health Innovation](#)

[on St. Clair Avenue.](#)

The price for the two-day 2016 Security Summit on Thursday and Friday – October 27 & 28 – at LaCentre is \$495 per person.

There is also a Golden Ticket which is good for all events, all days at a cost of \$850.

A 25 percent discount for all early bird registrants applies to all events, all days and could save registrants more than \$200 off the going rates. Current ISS members are eligible to receive the early bird discounts as are those who join when registering.

Tech -Toys Tuesday

The second installment of 2016 Security Summit Week will be Tech Toys Tuesday presented by [Malwarebytes](#) which will feature a 4-part professional development track.



The first part will be a day-long Hack Challenge where experienced security professionals will be presented with a sizeable security challenge to overcome. They will be given a piece of information that they will have to recover from a secure on-site server.

Bay Pointe will administer the Challenge right from LaCentre. Participants must be present at on-site to take part.

The second part of the program will be a series of product-specific or industry-wide training programs. Most of the programs are fee-based and will offer an examination-driven certification component which participants may schedule at a later date. Keep checking the SSW website for exact times and

specific training topics.

The day will also include a dedicated segment of programs or the CSO Xchange.

Tech-Toys Tuesday will conclude with an Xceptional Networking Reception featuring local brewers and distillers as well as appetizers.
