The 23rd Information & AI Security SUMMIT (ISS), the Midwest's largest gathering of security professionals, began as a homegrown idea by two resourceful IT managers from Northeast Ohio to elevate Cleveland's vibrant thought leadership in cybersecurity.

In 2002, Gary Sheehan and Glenn Brzuziewski, both working in IT Security services, came up with the idea to create a local, all-volunteer security conference that empowered professionals to learn without cost barriers or time to attend out-of-state meetings.

ISS's growth was immediate and significant, gaining support from the top IT security companies in the region and a host of cross-sector volunteers. What started as an entrepreneurial idea by Gary and Glenn to educate, collaborate, and evolve the local security community has now become the most significant and crucial cybersecurity gathering in the Midwest.

In 2024, ISS moved back to LaCentre in Westlake, OH.
